



Five well-appointed suites including one master suite are all air-conditioned with queen-size beds (two cabins can be converted to twin beds), en-suite bathrooms with shower, separate toilet, double wardrobes, and a writing desk.



Facilities

A library, lounge, bar, and indoor dining area seating up to 10 guests and plenty of space outside to unwind and enjoy the views. It is also equipped with complimentary Wi-Fi access, enabling guests to upload their trip photos on a daily basis.

Guests will be able to dine at leisure in the air-conditioned dining room or the outdoor deck areas. Meals and an extensive list of non-alcoholic beverages are all-inclusive, while alcoholic beverages including wines, beers, premium spirits, and cocktails are available for an additional charge.




Komodo Island



Komodo National Park is located in the centre of the Indonesian archipelago between islands of Sumbawa and Flores. The World Heritage site is blessed with secluded beaches, amazing coral reefs and crystal clear waters. The area has over 260 coral species and more than 1,000 species of reptiles, dolphins, manta rays, turtles, whales and dugongs. Komodo is considered one of the best dive sites in the world – diving or snorkelling in this area will truly leave you with extraordinary experiences.

Within the national park contains hundreds of unique species such as wild boars, water buffalos, deer's, monkeys and the famous Komodo Dragons. The Komodo Dragon is the largest land – dwelling reptile in the world with the largest found being 3.13 meters long and weighted 166KG. Their foot prints are often seen along pink sandy beaches, or while hiking in the hills with knowledgeable park rangers. They can live up to 50 years and grow over 100kg in weight and up to 3m from head to their tail tip. To raise their body temperature they bask in the sunlight during the day and burrow into the ground at night. They stalk, ambush and devour wild dear, pigs, buffalo and even horse for sustenance.

Raja Ampat

Raja Ampat translated means 'four kings', referring to the islands Salawati, Batanta, Waigeo and Misool covering over 17,000 km2 of pristine paradise. These are in turn surrounded by a myriad of amazing, untouched smaller isles with picturesque postcard beaches and sheer, ragged limestone cliffs.





The Baliem Valley, running through Irian Jaya's string of jutting mountain peaks, is home to the gentle warrior tribes of the highlands, the Dani. The region on the north-western tip of New Guinea compromises about 1,500 islands spread over 50,000 km2 of spectacular scenery. It is here where the remote islands of Misool, Wayag and Penemu are located. 70% of the worlds total number of coral species is said to be found in the amazing underwater world of Raja Ampat.

This area has one of the greatest and healthiest coral reefs for its size in the world with nearly 1,200 species of fish and 550 species of coral. Discover the most beautiful soft coral jungles in the world. Raja Ampat, is home to the

worlds most biodiverse marine region, a an underwater Shangri – la for diving enthusiast and marine biologists. Above the water, kayak in secret bays enclosed by jagged limestone pinnacles covered with orchids and tropical vegetation.


Cenderawasih Bay

Also known as Sarera Bay, in Papua, Indonesia, is a breathtaking destination spanning 14,535 km2. It features diverse ecosystems, including mangroves, coral reefs, tropical forests, and marine habitats teeming with wildlife. History enthusiasts can explore WWII relics like sunken aircraft and ships scattered in its waters.

Your adventure begins in Manokwari aboard the luxurious Alila Purnama. Cruise to Biak to dive among WWII wrecks and trek to spot birds of paradise. At Purup Island, snorkel vibrant coral reefs and encounter reef sharks. In Kwatisore, swim with majestic whale sharks for a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Ripon Island offers perfect visibility for diving amidst whales, dugongs, and vibrant fish. Conclude with a visit to Warirundi Island, known for its stunning coral reefs and unique marine life like coconut crabs and pygmy seahorses. End your journey with a farewell breakfast before departing from Manokwari.







Ambon to Sorong



Embark on a 10-day cruise through the breathtaking Banda Sea and Ceram Sea, journeying from Ambon to Raja Ampat or vice versa. Discover pristine dive sites, lush islands, and diverse marine life in what has been called the last paradise on earth.

Begin at Ambon Island, known for its volcanic beauty and tropical rainforests. Dive into the waters of Nusa Laut, teeming with turtles, reef fish, and dolphins. Explore Koon Island's vibrant reefs and witness abundant fish life.

Spend two days in Misool, a diver's haven with soft corals, sea fans, and unique creatures like wobbegong sharks. Visit Banda Islands for lava flow diving and explore historic spice plantations and Fort Belgica.

In the Dampier Strait, dive among schooling fish at Sardine Reef. Conclude your journey at Raja Ampat, famed for its pristine beaches, hidden coves, and unmatched biodiversity, before bidding farewell in Sorong.


